# Intensive English Program (IEP)

For individuals who want to improve their English and experience U.S. culture and student life on a large, traditional university campus

All ELI teachers have master's degrees in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL), and many

have lived and taught outside of the United States.

- 3. Pay the required \$50 application fee.
- 4. Upload your passport and financial support document.

\*Minimum age for students is 17 years old.

When the ELI receives and approves all documents, vou will receive an email with instructions on how to pay the required tuition deposit (\$250) and an optional express mail fee (\$50).

#### After you are accepted for admission, you will receive:

  - a. Your letter of acceptance for admission b. Your I-20 OR your DS-2019 document
  - c. More instructions about IEP admission, enrollment, and your travel to the United States

#### **Conditional Admission**

Apply for conditional admission to The University of Alabama (UA) if you need to improve your English.

#### Conditional admission is available to:

- Undergraduate students (Bachelor's degree)
- Graduate students (Master's or Doctoral degree)

If you have conditional admission, you will begin your studies in the UA English Language Institute (ELI).

#### Pathway to UA

#### English+Academic Credit

Pathway to UA allows students to earn academic credit toward their degree and improve their English at the same time.

#### **Program Details**

Students will study in Pathway to UA for one or two semesters. After completing this program, students will have 12-17 credits and will begin taking fulltime courses for credit.

#### One-semester program

- English requirement = 79+ iBT, 6.0+ IELTS, and IEP Level 6
- Possible start dates = January or August
- Academic credit earned = 12-17 credit hours
- Tuition cost = \$15,730 (estimate)

#### Two-semester program

- English requirement = 72-78 iBT, 5.5 IELTS, and IEP Level 5
- Possible start dates = January or August
- Academic credit earned = 15-20 credit hours
- Tuition cost = \$24,385 (estimate)

#### Accommodations

On-campus housing available: Walk to classes, enjoy the convenience, make friends, and experience campus life! Most ELI students live in dormitory-style residence halls, though sometimes apartment-style housing is available at a higher cost.
